○ **Novice**

- This was the first official year for Novice ½ ice; which became mandatory under Hockey Canada, effective the 2019/2020 season.
- Ran as combined age group, all ½ ice, 4-on-4.
- Hockey Calgary established four (4) tiers.
- The majority of the feedback has been positive. Players in ½ ice received more ice time, passes and puck touches. Many members may have seen the hard boards in Cardel Arena 1. These boards were sponsored by the Flames Foundation for using during Novice games.
- Central Region also changed the official / referee structure; where instead of having 2 Officials with an on-ice mentor; the mentor was in the stands for 75% of the games.
- NEW for 2020 / 2021: Hockey Calgary has committed to no GAMES scheduled before 8:00am on weekends.

○ **Timbits**

- Many of the program changes for Novice were applied to the Timbits program this year:
 - Roster sizes are larger than last year with target 18 to accommodate 4-on-4, plus goalies.
 - Teams are only permitted to play cross-ice (board to board, blueline down or in the neutral zone) within Calgary, and games hosted by Hockey Calgary teams.
 - Game play is almost identical to Novice formats.
- ⊖ There have been many requests for a set schedule in Timbits. We can do that with Timbits as there are no ‘seeding’ or ‘regular league’ games; so, we tried to set a schedule for the season. Unfortunately, we had an uneven # of teams so the only way to do that was with 3-team practices. Many large, successful Associations such as Bow Valley, Glenlake and Trails West do this format as a development model. We will be looking at how to better support this division, if we are required to run an odd number of teams this coming season.
- NEW for 2020/2021: Hockey Calgary will pilot the scheduling of Timbits games; in a tentative range of five (5) to eight (8) games per team.

○ **Age Category Name Changes**

- Hockey Canada announced that age divisions will be renamed for the 2020-2021 season, and there will be no more reference to Novice, Peewee, Midget etc.
- New naming conventions will be:

- Please note this is just a renaming, and does NOT affect the underlying program. There will be no additional opportunities for acceleration!

○ **Upcoming Initiatives**

- U11 (‘Atom’) Pathway

- Hockey Canada has introduced a new development program for U11, mandatory for the 2020/2021 season.
 - Preparation Phase (August 31st to September 7th)
 - Minimum four (4) ice sessions prior to evaluations beginning. This is an opportunity to “shake off the rust”, and give 1st year players familiarity with the rule changes, and larger ice surfaces.
 - Team Selection Phase (September 8th to September 30th)
 - Development Phase (October 1st to October 23rd)
 - Seeding / Regular Season (October 24th to February 21st)
 - Playoff Phase (March)
 - Off Season (April to August)
- For 60-minute games, the period structure will be 13-13-13 vs. current 12-15-15 in order to target game completion. For 75-minute games, the period structure will be 15-15-15.
- U11 Hybrid Goalie Program
 - U11 participants have the chance to participate as both a ‘goaltender’ and a ‘skater’ if they meet specific criteria. The U11 “hybrid goaltenders” will have the opportunity to dress as a ‘skater’ when not playing in goal. Registrants:
 - Must register as a hybrid goalie;
 - Must evaluate as both a ‘goaltender’ and a ‘skater’;
 - Must have a final positional division placement within 2 divisions, in order to be approved.
 - As per Hockey Calgary:
 - Teams are permitted to have a maximum roster size of 18-registrants.
 - Teams are permitted to have more than two (2) ‘Hybrid
 - Associations are required to ensure that all teams within the U11 age category have an equal number of registrants per teams (within 1 player), regardless of position specification.
 - More details to come in upcoming evaluation documents.
- Upcoming Initiative: U16 AA
 - New U16 operating under quadrant associations: Hockey Calgary will continue to host 8 – AAA U16 teams city-wide, but will add 4 – U16 AA for the 2020 / 21 season.
- Upcoming Initiative: League Structure Format Change
 - Shortened Seeding Round
 - Reduced to 4-weeks (5 weekends)
 - Reduction in Seeding Games
 - No Schedule Windows during this timeframe
 - Longer Regular Season
 - Starts prior to Christmas (early December)
 - Reduction in Seeding Round Games are added to ‘League Play’
 - Provincial participation is based on ‘League Play’
 - Potential for 7 – 9 Tournament weekends during the year
 - 2 – 3 weekends prior to start of the Seeding Round
 - 2 Weekends during ‘Seeding Break’ in late November
 - 1 Weekend (week) during Boxing Week
 - 1 Schedule Window Request during ‘Regular Season’
 - 2 Weekends following Playoffs
 - Schedule Window per team per year
 - Only permitted during League Play
 - *New* - will allow teams to take a window without a tournament sanction; which allows for a weekend off; and is limited to one weekend per team.

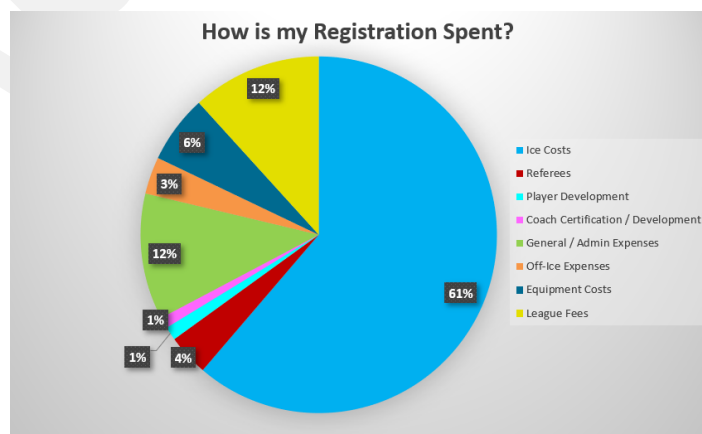
- **Upcoming Initiative: Tournament Planning**
 - **When can teams host or attend tournaments”**
 - Each age category has exceptions and limitations
 - Preseason: September 25 to October 23
 - Season Break: November 23 to December 6
 - Winter Break: December 24 to January 1
 - Post Season U9: February 23 to April 30
 - Post Season U11 to U18: March 18 to April 30
 - U9 to U18 teams may request one (1) Schedule Window during the Regular Season to host or attend a tournament. Schedule Windows will not be permitted during the Seeding Round (October 24 – November 22).
 - **Tournament Sanctions**
 - In-town Tournament Requests (games within Hockey Calgary boundaries):
 - Hockey Calgary will approve a maximum number of tournaments within each Age Category and Tier during each weekend of the Pre-season, Seasonal Break, Winter Break and Post-Season.
- **Boundary Announcement**
 - Will be coming; with regards to CKE
 - July 23rd, but the judge has way to many documents presented august 27th is new date.
 - Question. How many coming? Estimate was 50-70; however is a moving target
- **Registration Announcement**
 - From July 1 to August 15
 - There will be no fee increases
 - Payment plan extended to October

○ **Overview**

- We ended the 2019/20 season with a modest excess of revenue over program expenses
- SWHA has seen a decline in registration over the past several years
- The Association spent more on Hockey Development in 2019/20 season with the introduction of the team development reimbursement.
- We utilized a consistent amount of casino/AGLC funds as compared to prior year to offset program expenditures. AGLC type funds (casino or raffle) are critical to offset our program expenditures. Registration fees alone do not cover the cost of community hockey.
- Looking forward, and as already released with the opening of registration, our registration fees remain unchanged year over year. Our balance sheet is strong with sufficient liquidity to manage the challenges in this next year.
- Efforts to raise funds through our Cash Calendar Raffle are incredibly important to our programs. None of the funds raised last year by the cash calendar were used in operations in this past season and will be utilized within the prescribed two-year requirement set by AGLC.

FUNDRAISING REPORT – Presented by Ann Driscoll

- Cash Calendar Raffle
 - 14,680 tickets sold by 49 teams
 - \$146,800 was raised
 - Expenses were the following:
 - \$36,000 in prize money
 - \$500 to each team that sold all their tickets
 - Ticket printing, drum rental, binders and other printing
 - 25 teams sold all their tickets
 - Average was approx. 300 tickets sold per team
- Sponsorship
 - Thank you to Bite Dental (& Dr. Andy Hoe) for sponsoring the mouth guards again this year. Fees charged for the mouth guards were donated back to Southwest Hockey.
- Planning for 2020 – 2021
 - Casino
 - We are eligible for a Casino this year in Q4 (likely November or December). Slotting letter comes in May.
 - Volunteer positions will be posted start of the season. Will require approx.. 40 people
 - Raffle
 - With the current situation, there is uncertainty on how much revenue we could expect from the Casino.
 - Consideration being given to hold another raffle. Same format, and 10-tickets per player (\$10 each). Smaller prize pool.
 - While this would provide additional revenue to offset potential shortfall from the Casino, it would require additional volunteers on top of Casino volunteers. Having a raffle every year is consistent with what several other Associations do (in addition to Casinos).

 - Was used during practices, and would like to give thanks to the coaches that implemented this apparatus into their practices

- **Novice Teams**
 - For the 2020-2021 season, the Novice teams will now be supplied with SW Hockey white jerseys and they will be returned at the end of season; along with the Navy jerseys.
 - Novice goalie gear was also a big hit this year with the kids; as it was all done in SW Hockey colours on the glove, blocker, and pads.
- **Small Nets**
 - Timbits and Novice teams used the small nets, which was also a great implementation of the players this season.
 - Going forward all Timbits and Novice teams will be using the small nets and blue pucks again this season.
- **Apparel**
 - SW Hockey branding department is still carrying the following three (3) sizes of SW Hockey bags, pant shells in navy.
 - For the 2020-2021 season there will be:
 - White pant shells, ball caps, coffee warmers, jerseys, pins, decals (team number decals), SW Hockey license plate and many more items
 - The start of the season, SW Hockey turned to Adrenaline for apparel support for our teams. There was good use of the teams using Adrenaline for their team jackets and tracksuits.
- **Southwest Hockey Mascot; CELLY**
 - Made the scene again this year with many appearances around Calgary; from tournaments, to league games.
 - Santa Skate and team house parties also had an appearance by Celly
 - Could even find Celly roaming around Cardel all hours of the day; even for those 6:30am times!
 - Thank you Celly!

 - Player Prep Camps in August
 - Checking clinics for Bantam players
 - Available team development budgets: \$400 for Timbits and Novice. For Atom through Midget was the same; with an additional \$100 for goalies.
 - Preferred and additional vendor lists were made available and had preferred SW Hockey pricing.
- Goalie Development
 - Goalie Prep Camp in August with Derek Purfield of the Okotoks Oilers
 - Four (4) goalie development nights hosted by SW Hockey and instruction by Evolution Goaltending.
 - All evenings offered were filled.

- **Coach Development**
 - Two (2) coach steam nights hosted by SW Hockey and instruction by Hockey Alberta
 - Total of 32 coaches attended

Previously Bryce Davis held the Vice President Off-ice position. After two (2) years, the role transitions to the VP On-Ice role.

VICE PRESIDENT ON-ICE REPORT

COACHING REPORT – Presented by Bryce Davis

- There were 236 coaches serving within SW Hockey
- Total of 68 applicants submitted for head coaching positions for a total of 49 teams.
- All head coach applicants were interviewed in person by the Director and Assistant Director of Coaches; leading up to the selection process.
- SW Hockey conducted certification clinics at the beginning of 2019/20 season for all applicable coaches and in conjunction with SW Hockey Development & Hockey Calgary; multiple coach clinics were held through the season
- The annual year end coach survey was conducted and made available to all families on SW Hockey teams. There was a total of 322 responses which is down 112 from the 2018/19 total of 434.
 - Feedback trends were consistent with examples of past seasons.
- The role of Director of Coaches will be assumed by Sandy Grant; and the role of Assistant Director of Coaches will be decided on tonight; as there were four (4) nominations.

ELECTION for: Assistant Director of Coaches – Presented by Jeff Campbell

- **Rob Cowan, Kevin Franklin, Shane Maguire & Lincoln Reeves** have been nominated and accepted the nomination in writing.
- Each nominee will have an opportunity to address the membership, and then voting will occur through secret ballot.
- Rob Cowan was unable to be with us tonight, and speech will be read by Jeff Campbell on his behalf.

Ballots will now be handed out; for the membership in attendance to vote.

Voting results will be announced towards the end of the AGM, in the President Closing Statement.

ICE REPORT – Presented by Bryce Davis

- Southwest Hockey continued with using the OneClickIce Scheduling Software.
- Teams must keep in mind the numerous factors that are considered during the scheduling process. Such as, but not limited to:
 - Similar number of: hours, full / shared ices, total practice times, early / late times as well as the following checks and balances are done:
 - Minimum 15 – hours between ice times
 - Limit the number of back to back days
 - Blackout dates: If teams blacked out weekends, attempts were made to move their practices; however not always possible due to team availability vs. ice availability
 - Dry spells – aim to having none. A dry spell is only a dry spell if a team does not have a game or a practice.
- Breakdown of ice for this season was:
 - Averages were slightly down from year prior, as December tournament packages were introduced this past season.
 - Although averages are down over last year, SW Hockey is still above most of the Hockey Calgary average practices (or close to par) which were:
 - Timbits – 47 (SW – 45)

- NEW – There were December tournament ice packages offered this season in an effort to better utilize December ice; where teams did not always have a great turnout of players to their December ice practices.
 - Out of 7 packages offered, 5 were picked up. Two (2) packages were returned as teams could not find enough visiting teams to attend.
- SW Hockey has obtained a few ice slots at 7 Chiefs. There is a total of five (5) ice times added as a result of returning some Oakridge ice. Oakridge remains our highest cost per hour of ice; therefore, reduced ice and replaced with slightly less expensive ice at 7 Chiefs. SW Hockey had minimal ice slots at Acadia, ECTAS, Rose Kohn and Ed Whalen. These included early morning ice times; which SW Hockey has returned. The reduction of the ice, allows the association to better utilize the ice that is on contract.

EVALUATIONS REPORT – Presented by Bryce Davis

Overall, the evaluations process for the 2019/2020 season was successful.

- 1,000 players evaluated and placed within a 6-week timeframe.

What worked well?

- Dedicated coaches running the timed drills for all ice sessions. Consistency with all age groups helped these sessions run efficiently.
- Having Bantam and Midget as “on-ice coaches”, for younger age divisions. These hours earned, went towards family volunteer bonds.
- Increased communications to parents with respect to hearing about group notifications
- Continued with the “one-score” ranking vs. in the past where evaluators were asked to rank on multiple criteria. Allows evaluators to watch more of the game and less focused on filling in boxes.
- Continue having a mixture of age-group divisional coaches who have likely coached some of the kids in the past, plus other knowledgeable evaluators in the stands.
 - Allowed for more participation by coaches (their kids were already at the rink), and thus more data points in each player profile (primarily at Novice through Peewee).
- Extra effort identifying head coaches early and having them participate in the ‘bubble skates’
 - This required exceeding early morning meetings before ice-times, and willingness of the head coaches to answer the call and be at the rink with short notice.

What can we do better?

- Recruit additional evaluation committee volunteers to reduce stress and work-load for Age Group Coordinators; both on-ice and off-ice.
- Schedule Bantam and Midget evaluations later in the month to align with quadrant releases
- Continue to communicate and listen to member suggestions to help make improvements to the process each season.

Pending for the 2020/2021 Season

- Begin evaluations after the Labour Day long weekend.
- Initial groupings based on team placement; from prior year
- Utilizing half-ice boards for the U9 (Novice) evaluations to simulate actual game-play
- Reduce the number of 3v3 small area games and add full-ice 5v5; where applicable
- Reduce / eliminate the bubble games at the U9 (Novice), U11 (Atom) and U13 (Peewee) age divisions
- Addition of a ‘Top-40’ game for Team 1 placement
- Introduction of the Hybrid Goalie; at the U11 (Atom) age division
- Have multiple goalie evaluators
- Add an extra Evaluation Coordinator position; to help support process execution
