

# Hybrid Goalie – F.A.Q

### 1. What is the difference between a full-time goalie and a hybrid goalie?

- a. A full-time goalie is a participant who only trains and plays as a goalie.
- b. A hybrid goalie is a participant who plays as both a skater and a goalie in both practices and games.

### 2. Does the Association supply goalie gear?

- a. The expectation is that hybrid and full-time goalies provide their own goalie gear.
- b. There is some gear available through the Association, but it is not guaranteed that this equipment will fit your child.
- c. If you require goalie equipment, please reach out to our Director of Branding & Equipment at <u>branding@southwesthockey.ca</u> to see what may be available.

### 3. If I register my child but they change their mind, what can I do?

- a. You must reach out to the Registrar and the Director of Evaluations **PRIOR to the start of evaluations** to change your child's registration status.
- b. If evaluations have started your child must complete evaluations in the role which they were registered (i.e., Hybrid, Full-time Goalie, Skater).
- c. However, if your child wishes to change, during evaluations reach out to the Director of Evaluations **PRIOR to team placement to discuss options**.

### 4. If my child is a 'full-time' goalie, will they play 100% of the games?

- a. NO. Up to two (2) full-time goalies can be assigned to a single team.
- b. This means that both goalies would practice 100% of the practices; as a goalie, but the game play would be split 50/50.
- c. It is ideal to have two (2) goalies on every team; however, some teams may only have one goalie which will be dependent on the number of goalies registered.
- d. When full-time goalies are not playing as a goalie in a game they must be dressed as a goalie on the bench.
- e. They are **NOT** allowed to play as a skater in the game.

#### 5. If my child is a 'hybrid' goalie how often will they play as a skater and as a goalie?

- a. This depends on how many hybrids and full-time goalies are on the team.
- b. There can be more than two (2) hybrid goalies per team.
- c. The playing time will be split evenly among all hybrid goalies.

### 6. How will my child be evaluated if they are a hybrid goalie?

- a. Your child will attend two (2) goalie specific sessions for evaluations; which are evaluated by the SW Hockey approved Third-Party Goalie Company.
- b. They will also attend the 1<sup>st</sup> Skill evaluated session for U11 skaters.
- c. Then for the remaining sessions your hybrid will be split between participating as a skater and as a goalie.
- d. They will have two (2) more evaluations than other skaters and one (1) more evaluation than full-time goalies to ensure they are evaluated in both positions.

# 7. Is there goalie specific training available to U11 hybrid goalies through the Association?

### a. Academy & Cougars Club Programs

- i. Option to register for this program as either a skater or a goalie. There is no hybrid option.
- ii. Details about this program and its instructor(s) can be found on the SW website.

### b. Goalie Nights

- i. Monthly Camps for goalies U11 to U18 are offered.

### 8. What age groups is the hybrid goalie program available for?

a. The Hybrid Goalie program is unique to U11, and is not offered in any other age division.
